

## Annual Report Summary: 2019/20



An estimated 559,400 people live in Somerset (Source: Somerset Intelligence)



The most common location where people were identified as being at risk was their own home (37%)



We didn't publish any Safeguarding Adult Reviews this year

The Somerset Safeguarding Adults Board (SSAB) became statutory in 2015 under the Care Act (2014)

One of the responsibilities of the SSAB is to undertake Safeguarding Adult Reviews



An estimated 136,900 are aged 65 and over (Source: Somerset Intelligence)



Mental Capacity Act 2005

In 571 cases the adult at risk was assessed as lacking capacity to make decisions related to the safeguarding enquiry



We published a practice briefing for 'Kevin', and published new guidance on 'What to do if it's not Safequarding' as a result of the learning from this case



3038 safeguarding concerns were raised with Somerset County Council



The majority of people (95%), or their representative, were asked what their desired outcomes were



We updated our **Joint** Safeguarding Adults Multi -Agency Policy and Selfneglect practice guidance, and published People in a Position of Trust

The SSAB has three statutory partners that the Care Act (2014) says must be members:

- Somerset County Council
- NHS Somerset Clinical Commissioning Group
- Avon & Somerset Constabulary






This led to 1144 safeguarding enquiries under Section 42 of the Care Act (2014)



In 99% of cases where desired outcomes were stated they were either partially of fully achieved



We once again carried out annual self-audit process





In 95% of cases the risk was removed or reduced.



We continued to see growth in people using our website, and engaging with us using social media


Other key organisations that work with adults in Somerset also have a representative on the SSAB.

The most common risk type was Neglect and Acts of Omission which accounted for 33% of risks



As of March 2020, 88.64% of Somerset's regulated settings were good or better, in comparison to 86.21% nationally
