

Annual Report Summary: 2020/21

The Somerset Safeguarding Adults Board (SSAB) became statutory in 2015 under the Care Act (2014)

One of the responsibilities of the SSAB is to undertake <u>Safeguarding Adult Reviews</u>

The SSAB has three statutory partners that the <u>Care Act (2014)</u> says must be members:

- Somerset County Council
- NHS Somerset Clinical Commissioning
 Group
- Avon & Somerset Constabulary

Other key organisations that work with adults in Somerset also have a representative on the SSAB.

2766 safeguarding concerns were raised with <u>Somerset County</u>
<u>Council</u>



This led to 832 safeguarding enquiries under Section 42 of the Care Act (2014)

The most common <u>risk type</u>
was Neglect and Acts of
Omission which accounted for
27% of risks



The most common location where people were identified as being at risk was their own home (47%)



Mental Capacity Act 2005



The majority of people (96%),

or their representative, were

asked what their desired

outcomes were

In 99.7% of cases where desired outcomes were stated they were either partially of fully achieved



In 97% of cases the risk was removed or reduced.

Safeguarding Adults Review: Final Report

'Luke' had a long history of neglecting his own health and wellbeing before moving to a care home where he continued to neglect himself and developed a diabetic foot ulcer In 393 cases the adult at risk was assessed as lacking capacity to make decisions related to the safeguarding enquiry



'<u>Damien</u>' had a long history of contact with mental health services. He misused a variety of substances, and his vulnerability was exploited by others.



We published a range of safeguarding leaflets for the public and new guidance on Safeguarding and Medicines Management and Organisational Abuse



Due to the impact of the pandemic we did not carry out an audit this year. We have worked with other SABs in the region to develop a joint one for 2021
